A clear passageway of 3M should be maintained between adjacent awnings when extended and the gap should not be blocked with windbreaks or any other apparatus. All vehicles should be able to leave the rally site without obstruction, driving forwards.		
Vehicle Fire	Any Unit on Site	Low	All Units should carry their own fire equipment. In the event of a fire personnel must vacate the unit the Fire Brigade must be notified. If safe to do so, without interfering with the Fire Brigade arrival, neighbouring units may be moved, and the fire may be fought with that equipment available on site.
